An Unintentional Christmas Gift

We tend not to think of ourselves being connected with evil people or evil spirits. We saw that in the message, *Me, You...and Barabbas?* We tend not to think of ourselves being connected with evil people or evil spirits at Christmas either.

But what about connecting Christmas and Satan?

We think the battle with Satan was fought and won at the resurrection. But did we ever think Satan was defeated with the birth of Jesus Christ?

We tend to limit the birth of Jesus to a baby born in a cave or a shed. <u>With</u> an ox or a cow, <u>and</u> a donkey. <u>And</u> shepherds who came. <u>And</u> the three wisemen. <u>And</u> an angel hovering overhead. Oh, and let's not forget the little drummer boy, too. And all the while in the background Boney M are singing, "Mary's Boy Child".

Why do we limit Christmas to this? Because of commercialism. In a cave or in a shed because there was no room at the inn. Or any other accommodation. No relative took them in. Remember they had to go to where Joseph was from.

And there were no B 'n B's in those days.

But Jesus's birth was so much more than what commercialism gives us.

In the garden when Satan deceived Eve, where was Adam? He was standing beside her with his mouth shut. Not saying a word (Gen. 3:6). That's why Satan triumphed. Adam did not stand up and defend his wife.

Later when God spoke to Satan in Gen. 3:14-15 He said something that got Satan's attention.

"So the Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, "Cursed are you above all livestock and all wild animals! You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will crush your head, and you will strike His heel."

Satan must have wondered, "Who IS this seed that is going to crush MY head?"

He knew some time in the future someone was going to give him trouble. And over the subsequent years he heard prophecies about some 'coming Messiah'. "Maybe this Messiah will be the One who will give me trouble?"
